May 9 – Safe and Secure Living Fair presented by Chinese Christian Mission where RARC is an invited guest to talk about the role of Amateur radio in emergency communications.

May 24 - 7<sup>th</sup> SOS Children's Village Run and Walk where RARC has been invited every year to provide radio communications and logistical support for this popular community fundraiser.

June 27-28 – Field Day for RARC and all Amateur radio organizations and operators across Canada and the U.S. This annual 24-hour event is an emergency exercise that is part radio operations, part education and part public relations.

July 1 – RARC members work with event organizers, parade marshals and local authorities in radio communications for the annual Steveston Salmon Festival and Canada Day Parade.

"Participation at these events not only supports local community activities but also creates training opportunities for our members to become better prepared in assisting local emergency programs," says Eric Scott, president of RARC. "We see the volunteer efforts of RARC members an integral part of the Richmond community working together for a common interest."
